Luke 10:25-37 –

10:30 – Jerusalem is the place of peace, symbolic of communion with God. **Jericho**, on the other hand, was renowned as a place of sin. **Jericho** was notorious as a place of iniquity and is commonly associated with sinful living. Falling **among thieves** speaks to the natural consequence of journeying away from God toward a life of sin. The ultimate **thief** is Satan, who spreads lies and heresies among the people of God, luring away both leaders and people. **Life**

means living in God's grace here on earth, while the more abundant life indicates the Kingdom to come.

10:31, 32 – Titles and positions are meaningless in God's sight when good deeds do not accompany them: "The dignity of the priesthood means nothing unless he also excels in deeds." (St. Cyril of Alexandria). That the **priest** and the **Levite** do not help the man also indicates the failure of the Old Testament Law to heal the consequences of sin.

10:33 – The **Samaritan**, while a despised foreigner, is an image of Christ (Jn. 8:48), for He "came down from heaven" (Creed) to save even those in rebellion against Him.

10:34, 35 – The bandages, **oil**, and **wine** are sacramental images for (1) the garment of baptism, which delivers us from the wounds of sin; (2) the oil of chrismation, which gives us new life in the Holy Spirit; and (3) the communion of the divine Blood, which leads to eternal life. **His own animal** indicates Christ bearing our sins in His own body, and the **inn** reveals the Church in which Christ's **care** is received. He pays the price for that care (1 Co. 6:20; 7:23).

RECTORY OFFICE HOURS are 10 A.M. to 4 P.M. Monday thru Friday.

EMERGENCY SICK CALLS can be made anytime. Please notify your Pastor when someone is taken to the hospital; Sacred Scriptures remind us to call the presbyter to anoint the sick.

MARRIAGES are celebrated on Saturdays and Sundays. Consult the Pastor at least 6 months in advance and before wedding reception plans have been made. Marriages cannot be celebrated during Lent or Advent, or on Fridays.

BAPTISMS are scheduled on Saturdays and Sundays at 11 A.M. Two God-parents are required; at least one of whom must be an Orthodox Christian by Faith, and the other a practicing Christian. An infant's first or middle name must be a saint's name.

CHURCH FUNERALS are provided for parishioners who are current in their spiritual and financial obligations to the Parish. Otherwise, burial is from the funeral home. The Church does not permit cremation.

THE NATIVITY FAST

During this period of prescribed fasting, we are to abstain from meats, dairy, eggs, cheeses, and all animal products. The Church does allow fish on the weekends during the Nativity fast.

Fasting is so important for the Orthodox Christian that many of the Fathers tell us we cannot consider ourselves to be Orthodox unless we keep the fasts. The spiritual discipline of keeping the fast is invaluable to the Christian life, for it helps make us lighter and more open to spiritual growth. We enter fasting periods because we want to go deeper in our life in Christ and gain strength in fighting the passions.

It is important to remember that fasting is not just about the foods we are to abstain from, but also about the quantity of food we eat. It is hardly a true fast if we eat the same amount of food we would normally eat when not fasting. Furthermore, if we avoid simple foods such as vegetables, breads, and vegan soups, and eat rich foods that are just as satisfying as non-fasting foods, we miss the point of the fast. It is hardly fasting if we consume a great variety of food in large amounts.

Rather than needing the fanciest boots of the season, we look to having feet that walk in Christ's footsteps, steps of humility and instead of the best gloves, we want Christ's hands that are open and giving freely to all people. Let's prepare for an Orthodox Season of Christmas this November 28th with the Fast!
