4:15 – The term **Galilee of the Gentiles** indicates that many non-Jews lived in the region.

Having a mixed population, it was not considered a genuinely Jewish land, even though many Gentile residents had converted to Judaism during the Maccabean period. Because many of the Jews there had been influenced by the Greek culture and its customs, they were generally considered second-class citizens by the Jews of Judea.

4:16 – **Darkness** means ungodliness. Here it represents the Gentiles' unawareness of God and the Jews being under the shadow of the Old Covenant. To sit in darkness means to be overcome by spiritual ignorance. The **great light** is the gospel of Jesus Christ.

4:17 – Christ's first word, like that of John the Baptist, is "**Repent.**"

3:1-3 – **The wilderness of Judea** is the barren region descending from Jerusalem to the Dead Sea. The preparation for the Savior's ministry begins with John the Baptist's call to **repent**. Repentance, which accompanies faith, is a total about-face. The word in Greek literally means to change one's mind, or more generally, to turn around. Repentance is a radical change of one's spirit, mind, thought, and heart, a complete reorientation of the whole of one's life. It is the necessary first step in **the way of the Lord**. It is accompanied by the confession of sins and the act of baptism (v. 6), and it is followed by a life filled with fruits worthy of this change (v. 8)

BAPTISMS are scheduled on Saturdays and Sundays at 11 A.M. Two God-parents are required; at least one of whom must be an Orthodox Christian by Faith, and the other a practicing Christian. An infant's first or middle name must be a saint's name.

CHURCH FUNERALS are provided for parishioners who are current in their spiritual and financial obligations to the Parish. Otherwise, burial is from the funeral home. The Church does not permit cremation.

WHEN DESPONDENCY SEIZES US

The renowned Russian saint Seraphim of Sarov (1759-1833) said of himself, "I don't know anything." These words were remarkable coming from a hermit who was the most sought-after spiritual adviser of his age, with even the tsar seeking his counsel. Yet St. Seraphim recognized that he was but a funnel, so anything good that came out of him was from God.

As a priestmonk, I am often tortured with the knowledge that I am a poor example to others and I fall short – daily – of living out the image of Christ in me. Yet I am compelled to live every day with joyfulness of heart, no matter what. I am also compelled to preach, teach, write of the things of the Lord, and try to trust God, no matter what. I try, as best I can, to remember the words, "Rejoice in the Lord always. Again I will say, rejoice!" (Phil. 4:4).

I also try to remember the words of St. Basil the Fool for Christ, whose holy relics reside in the cathedral in Red Square that bears his name. He said, "Winter is cold, but paradise is sweet." Like St. Anthony the Great, I cry out to God, "Where are You?" all the while floating in a river of grace. I want to be a friend of God, yet I often feel like the eagle chick who has been pushed out of the nest by its mother.

I am comforted by the counsel of St. Seraphim, who instructed his spiritual children with these words:

When despondency seizes us, let us not give in to it. Rather, fortified and protected by the light of faith, let us with great courage say to the spirit of evil: "What are you to us, you who are cut off from God, a fugitive from heaven, and a slave of evil? You dare not do anything to us: Christ, the Son of God, has dominion over us and over all. Leave us, you thing of bane. We are made steadfast by the uprightness of His Cross. Serpent, we trample on your head."

PREPARATION FOR THE BLESSING OF HOMES, BEGINNING THIS FRIDAY (JANUARY 19)!

Before the Priest arrives at your home, here are a few reminders on how to prepare:

- + In the main room of the home, usually the kitchen or dining room, have placed on the table a white cloth, a candle and/an Icon or cross. You may place a small container of Holy Water on the table as well. (Note: Father will bring water with him.
- + Turn off TVs, radios, computers, etc. so as to keep focused on the blessing service.
- + Please make sure that pets are heeled or restrained so as not to get underfoot while Father goes through the home.
- + If you have any items to blessed (Icon, Cross, etc.), put them on the table where the blessing takes place.
- + When the Priest arrives, have everyone in the home gather around the table where the blessing takes place. Participation is important!
- + Invite friends or neighbors to participate and witness the beauty of this holy tradition.
- + If you need to discuss a personal matter with Father, this is the time to do so.

The sanctification of residences will be conducted from Monday to Saturday each week during the afternoon hours 1-5 and the evening hours 7-9. If you have a preference for an afternoon or evening visit, please notify Fr. Michael. Your priest shall begin blessing the homes of parishioners living in the Homestead, Munhall, and West Mifflin areas, proceeding with the city of Pittsburgh and concluding in outlying areas (north, south, east and west). Remember, the invitation to the priest to come and bless your home is an invitation to ask for the mercy of God upon the household. The sprinkling of Holy Water is a sign of God's presence in the home as an extension of His Holy House, the Church. It is a time to renew our commitment to God as we begin another year in His mercy and love for mankind.
