#### Luke 10:25-37 -

**10:30 – Jerusalem** is the place of peace, symbolic of communion with God. **Jericho**, on the other hand, was renowned as a place of sin. **Jericho** was notorious as a place of iniquity and is commonly associated with sinful living.

**10:31, 32** – Titles and positions are meaningless in God's sight when good deeds do not accompany them: "The dignity of the priesthood means nothing unless he also excels in deeds."

(St. Cyril of Alexandria). That the **priest** and the **Levite** do not help the man also indicates the failure of the Old Testament Law to heal the consequences of sin.

**10:33** – The **Samaritan**, while a despised foreigner, is an image of Christ (John 8:48), for He "came down from heaven" (Creed) to save even those in rebellion against Him.

**10:34, 35** – The bandages, **oil,** and **wine** are sacramental images for (1) the garment of baptism, which delivers us from the wounds of sin; (2) the oil of chrismation, which gives us new life in the Holy Spirit; and (3) the communion of the divine Blood, which leads to eternal life. **His own animal** indicates Christ bearing our sins in His own body, and the **inn** reveals the Church in which Christ's **care** is received. He pays the price for that care (1 Co. 6:20; 7:23).

# THE SAINTS AND THE POOR By Abbot Tryphon of The Morning Offering

The Orthodox Church is very clear in her teaching regarding the poor. Our Lord Jesus Christ taught us by His example as the great philanthropos, and we can do nothing less than follow. He commanded us to love and serve the poor and hungry. He told us we must care for the sick and suffering, and that we must visit those in prisons and clothe the naked.

The Church's liturgical hymns and seasons are filled with the commemoration of saints who were known for their love of the poor. St. Basil the Great of the third century established Church-sponsored hospitals and mental institutions. St. Nicholas of Myra distributed money to those in need. St. John the Almsgiver was one of the most charitable patriarchs of the Byzantine Empire. St. Joseph of Volokholamsk emphasized the ancient monastic tradition of hospitality and care for the poor, and St. Elizabeth, a grand duchess of Russia, established hospitals for the poor and destitute. The newly canonized saint Mother Maria Skobtsova created soup kitchens and established houses of hospitality in World War II France.

The holy saints provide unique examples to the rest of us of what it means to be Christian. They showed forth the light of Christ by following His example of love for the poor, giving of their talents, time, and money to those in need. Orthodox Christians hold up the saints as exemplary people whose lives are worthy of emulation. They show us the way to live out the Gospels and point out the way of Christ.
